



Nature in the city: the triple zone approach

When developing new combinations and product concepts, Verver Export takes account of the 'triple zone approach' for nature in the city. Account is thereby taken of the distinctive characteristics of the urban environment when using bulbs, annuals and perennials for public planting.

Let's list them for you again:



1. The core zone

In the core zone, the environment for plants and animals is almost entirely shaped by humans. It has its own (micro-)climate, the water system is usually artificial, and the original substrate has often disappeared. For Verver Export this is the space where concepts are used that involve **display planting**.

2. The marginal zone

In the marginal zone the natural environment for plants and animals is still largely intact (often with the exception of the soil structure). However, human activities mean that most of the original plants and animals have virtually disappeared. There is quite a lot of public green space, but this tends to be urban types adapted to the built environment. Verver Export develops concepts and applications for this zone that fit with a **functional planting** approach.

3. The transitional zone

In the transitional zone the environment for plants and animals is usually intact, including the original soil. There is only scattered development. The transitional zone can be very species-rich; it forms the boundary region and the contact zone between the city and the surrounding landscape. For this zone, Verver Export recommends more **natural planting** with bulbs for naturalising and perennial planting planted mechanically in verges.

Taking account of the nature of a particular zone when designing and managing plantings results in variation in the planting and reinforces the identity of the various parts of the urban area. A useful assessment can be made by differentiating between three aspects: aesthetic quality, ecological quality and the usage value of the planting.

At Verver Export we are keen to help you think around this theme so that the right plant/concept ends up in the right place!

With our Summer Trams and Tram Vivas you can conjure up the most beautiful, colourful borders, roundabouts and parks.





Functional greenery!

More space to play with concepts such as Tram Vivas, flower meadows with lilies and seeds or butterfly-friendly plantings.



Natural greenery!

Often for public spaces that can be less frequently maintained, so perfectly suited to Tram Robuste perennial concepts and machine-planted lilies with flower seeds.

Dahlia craze

Dahlia development really started to take off after a staff member at the Madrid botanical garden managed to grow plants from seeds from Mexico in 1789. The plant was named after Swedish botanist Andreas Dahl. Explorers, famous and less well-known growers and even Empress Joséphine - Napoleon's wife, collected the colourful flowers and discovered new colours all the time.

From 1820 to 1860, dahlias were so popular that there was talk of a dahlia craze. Over the last few decades, the Dahlia had a somewhat stuffy image, but more recently dahlias have become hip again. Is this the start of a new craze?

Dinnerplate dahlias were cultivated in Europe in the late 1800s. The name says it all - the flowers can grow as big as a dinner plate. Not everyone agrees with this comparison and name. Our catalogue therefore calls them Deco Jumbo because they are large, and they always have a decorative flower shape.

They are definitely the 'Grand Dames' among dahlias.

Breeding

Genetically short, richly flowering

In America during the 1970s and 1980s, it was very common to use chemicals to keep plants short. While in the Netherlands, breeding was used to produce genetically shorter plants. This was also the case with the Dahlia.

Today, the tubers of these genetically compact but richly flowering dahlias - the Gallery Dahlia - are produced by a group of growers and they constantly develop new colours. Suitable for pots and borders.

Different view of (public) green spaces

Everyone loves to see the local area filled with flowers and greenery. It's attractive for bees and butterflies, and for residents and visitors too. Unfortunately, grass strips are often mowed regularly, preventing flowers from forming buds and blooming. Time for an action (management) plan!



Inventory

As existing green spaces offer plenty of opportunities to develop into a flower-rich green community, we recommend first taking an inventory.

Identify the available green spaces based on:

- vegetation present
- the location (traffic / buildings)
- the amount of sunlight
- soil type and
- function of the green space.

Simple effective action plan

A simple action (management) plan can be made by classifying the identified green spaces according to the following action points:



Give it a chance

Less mowing/pruning to allow flowery grassland or woodlands to emerge.



Connect

Leave a one-metre strip unmown on the border of lawn and shrubs to create a transitional area of mid-height vegetation. This is perfect to let bees and butterflies connect tall and low vegetation.



Active management

Cultivate land and sow with flowery seed mix, native flower bulbs and/or plant native trees and shrubs.



Do nothing

Current management sufficient based on existing use and possibilities.

More flowers and a varied and naturally managed greenery will create a chain reaction: more bees and butterflies, more insects in general, as well as more birds, hedgehogs and other animals. And the result is a bright and attractive town or city!




Embryo culture

Asexual lily propagation

Thanks to recent techniques such as embryo culture, some new crosses have been developed that were previously thought impossible: LO group (crosses between Longiflorum and Oriental), OA group (crosses between Asiatic and Oriental) and OT group (crosses Oriental and Trumpet lilies).

The hybrids are grown asexually (i.e. not by pollen, pistil and seed production) but by tissue culture, scaling the bulbs or by cultivating the small bulbs growing along the stem. This is how the desired number of genetically identical bulbs can be grown and a cultivar is created.

The plants for the Summer Trams are supplied by various producers in Heerhugowaard, the Netherlands. The wooden transport racks are assembled, the plants are sorted by Tram and placed in trays and then placed by order on the shelves. All orders are loaded on Sundays or Mondays, so they can be delivered as quickly as possible.

The order picking takes place in the greenhouses of Verver Export, so that the plants remain in the dark for only a short time during transport. The plants should be watered immediately after arrival - we do not water them too much before the transport to avoid Botrytis.

Notes on planting

1. With our Summer Trams you can easily achieve a beautiful summer bloom.
2. The ready-to-plant Trams are delivered driven in a pot.
3. Your individual planting plan is included in the delivery.
4. With design concept for a complete flower bed of a certain size.
5. Delivery from KW 20.

Tips

- The best result is achieved by sticking to the provided planting plan.
- First place the pots in the desired places and then plant the plants and flower bulbs. This allows you to make changes if needed.
- Remove the weeds after planting, especially in the first period of time.
- After 4 to 6 weeks, the flower beds are fully developed; then weeds will stop growing.
- Fertilize with fertilizer in mid-July to achieve a long flowering period.
- Remove the withered flowers from the dahlias about every three weeks. So the plant will bloom until the autumn.

Green Network Initiatives

Across Europe, local, regional and national (public) green initiatives are emerging to meet the Green Deal targets set by the European Union. The green network is intended to ensure that rural nature is connected to the heart of towns and villages. We've highlighted a few of the initiatives!




SE – Urban Farming - a growing trend in Malmö

The city of Malmö, Sweden, encourages urban agriculture and gardening as a way to create social interaction, improve health, increase biodiversity and reduce its climate footprint.

In Malmö, there are several ways to do some farming or gardening in an urban environment. There are many different models, from community gardens in squares and parks aimed at community building to commercial plots for gardeners trying to become commercially profitable. Although there is a formal agreement with the city of Malmö to provide garden space, there is no charge for gardening on public land. The associations that manage the gardens cater to different target groups and activities: some are very active in engaging schoolchildren in various educational courses, while others provide a meeting place for neighbours.





DE – Red Riding Hood Garden in Bremen

In 2021, a neighbourhood initiative was formed to temporarily use the site of an old restaurant "Rotkäppchen" that had been derelict for almost three years. Sadly, this wonderfully central space was very neglected and had been a bit of an eyesore for a long time. The initiative wanted to make temporary use of the space for a community garden and meeting place for people in the neighbourhood. With the kind support of the property owner, the first pop-up garden in the Bremer Viertel was born.

In March 2022, the community initiative was given a new site that could be used for longer, less than 500 m away from the old garden. In the context of the climate crisis and people feeling increasingly alienated from nature, this area aims to revitalise a sense of belonging in urban life. It also serves as a meeting place for the neighbourhood in the form of a community garden with a cultural programme. Together, the group achieved an enormous amount in just one season.



BE – Picking flowers in the cemetery

Great initiatives! 60.000 flower bulbs have been planted in the various cemeteries around Chapelle-lez-Herlaimont. Residents can pick a small bouquet of flowers before they visit the grave of a loved one. Summer flowering bulbs were planted in Ville de Ciney for the same purpose. A great initiative to create a bond between the community and the local council and a way to make the cemeteries more beautiful.

We plant lilies with flower seeds after tilling with the 50 or 100 cm machine.

Roadmap to sustainable machine summer planting



When to plant Plant summer flowering bulbs by machine in spring. This can be done once the soil temperature starts to rise again. An occasional night frost is no problem as it takes a while for the bulbs to emerge above ground.




Soil preparation Tilling to about 15 cm deep is recommended. To prevent grass and weed germination/growth, we recommend creating a false seed bed. In short: till the soil once, 3–4 weeks before planting. During planting, till the soil again.




Additional soil Add a layer of soil to raise and improve the soil, possibly with Terracottem soil improver.



Planting Plant the mixture of bulbs over a width of 1 meter with the planting machine. The reversible tiller tips the soil back over the bulbs that drop down through the machine.



Ground cover application There are two reasons for laying ground cover over machine-planted summer bulbs. Firstly, to keep the soil moist during the summer months, and secondly to protect against frost in winter.



Summer maintenance After the dahlias emerge, they should be topped once more when they reach a height of 30–40 cm. By cutting the stems back by about 15 cm, more stems will form which will be sturdier. The plants should be watered during times of prolonged drought.



End of season maintenance At the end of the season, dahlias will stop flowering and die after a first night frost. It is possible to mow the planting in late autumn and remove any plant debris.




Spring flowering Spring flowering bulbs can be manually planted to these summer flower meadows/ strips. Plant them after removing the old foliage from summer flowering plants.

The benefits of perennial plants and bulbs

Perennial plants and bulbs have several characteristics that make them perfect for green spaces.

The main advantages of perennial plants:

- They are perennial herbaceous plants that overwinter with their roots and grow again in the spring. They are planted as young plants and can then stay in one place for many years.
- They usually reproduce by vegetative propagation, either underground or above ground. This means they fill an area quickly and are less likely than annual plants to spread where they are not wanted.
- Perennials grow into a nice compact plant in the first year and have great ornamental value. Woody plants take much longer to do this.
- Perennial plants don't develop as quickly as annuals and therefore require less nutrients.

Success with tram vivas!

The influence of the soil (type of soil), its acidity and organic matter content plays an important role in the choice of perennials in your planting plan, your fertilisation plan and any soil improvement measures you take. Verver Export makes it simple for you!

SOIL & SOIL TYPE

The most important parameter of a soil is its texture. This refers to the most important fraction of the various soil particles found in that particular soil. The main fractions are: sand, loam and clay.

The particle size of the grains present is of decisive importance in giving a soil its texture class.

Texture = ratio between the different sizes of soil particles

We use the following texture classification:



Sand: particles between 2 mm - 0.05 mm à good drainage, poor sorption

- Grainy between the fingers
- Visible



Loam: particles between 0.05 and 0.002 mm

- Smooth between the fingers
- Individual grains no longer visible



Clay: particles smaller than 0.002 mm à poorer drainage, good sorption

- Soapy between the fingers
- Individual grains no longer visible

Adapt your perennial concept to the prevailing soil type, acidity and organic fraction!

The soil type determines to a large extent 2 parameters that are of exceptional importance for plant growth and whose target zone depends on the soil type:

- the degree of acidity (represented by the pH)
- the organic fraction (represented by the humus content)

The degree of acidity

The degree of acidity (pH) is a measure of the presence of free hydrogen ions in the soil. The more free hydrogen ions in the soil, the lower the pH and thus the more acidic the soil. If few free hydrogen ions are present, the pH increases and the soil is more alkaline. If the soil is (too) acidic, the pH can be increased by adding lime.

The pH of a soil is extremely important for various processes in the soil, which directly and indirectly determine the growth of ornamental plants.

Thus, the pH is important for, among other things:

- the soil structure
- the composition of soil life
- the increased fixation and thus difficult availability of certain nutrients
- the increased solubility and therefore increased availability or even flushing of certain nutrients.

The target pH depends on the soil texture. Therefore, it is very important to know the acidity of the soil!

Also know that the use of (especially) chompost and (to a lesser extent) composts (strongly) deacidify the soil. Especially acid-loving plant species such as Rhododendrons can get into trouble as a result (leaf yellowing due to iron and/or manganese deficiency).

The humus fraction of soil

Humus is the residual product of the decomposition process of organic material such as farmyard manure, compost, leaf litter, dead roots, dead animal organisms and so on. The bacterial decomposition of all these organic substances into humus continually releases nutrients that become available to the plants. In the end, a residual product is formed that is difficult to digest, which we call humus. The humus will decompose slowly (over several decades).

Perennials are sensitive to the humus content of the soil.

Perennials which require poor soil but are planted in rich soil will grow strongly, but will hardly flower. Perennials which require rich soil but are placed on low humus will grow scarcely, remain pale and form small flowers (or none at all) prematurely.

The amount of lime that needs to be spread to neutralise overly acidic soils depends on the soil texture, the measured pH and the intrinsic acid-binding value of the chosen lime fertiliser.

Never lime by feel; you can ruin the soil. Follow the instructions.

TIP

Choose your plant concept on the basis of the prevailing humus condition. If the humus content is really too low, add extra organic material to the soil (compost, soil improver). Humus content too high - then sanding can be considered.







Creating the bed



To minimise maintenance, it is important to create the optimum conditions for the plants at the time of planting.

Beds in existing beds: when planting in an existing bed, the soil present should be stable and it should be easy to see any problems that need to be addressed. These might include drainage problems, the presence of root weeds or shading by adjacent vegetation.

New beds: some beds cannot be made suitable for perennials with simple improvements. The only solution is then to bring in clean soil or drastically improve the existing soil. When replacing the soil, choose top-up soil that is similar to the surrounding soil to avoid creating disruptive layers.

Soil free of root weeds: root weeds such as ground elder, hedge bindweed, couch grass, etc. in a bed with perennials make for high maintenance. You need to remove both these root weeds and taproot weeds in advance. The soil should then be thoroughly tilled. Depending on the quality of the soil, it is usually enough to simply add organic matter (working this organic matter through the top 10 to 15 centimetres of the soil). Our plants are supplied with a nutrient buffer that is more than sufficient for a growing season.

Planting time: planting is usually done in spring so that the plants have a whole season to grow densely. In practice, planting is also often still being done in June. This is a good time because most weeds can be easily removed then and there is still sufficient rainfall.

Covering layer: since it takes one season for the planting to become dense, it is a good idea to take additional measures against weeds such as applying a layer of mulch. Wood chips or tree bark are often used. These materials decompose relatively quickly, but this is not a problem for perennials after the first season. One disadvantage of the decomposing mulch is that it disturbs the C/N ratio in the soil. Mulches contain a lot of carbon and extract nitrogen from the soil for digestion. This can cause the plants to turn yellow.

Maintenance



The lion's share of maintenance is required shortly after planting.

Weeding in the first year: after planting, weeding needs to be carried out during the season in the first year. This should definitely be done by hand. Hoeing the beds can easily damage the plants' rhizomes, preventing the bed from becoming sufficiently dense. This is obviously very important for plants that form underground rhizomes. Experience shows that maintenance is greatly reduced in subsequent years if weeds are consistently removed in the first year.

Don't cut plants back before winter: most perennials die back in autumn. The brown leaves and stems of the flowers make for an attractive winter scene. The dead leaves also provide a protective layer over the plant; this layer is essential for good regrowth in spring. The dead parts of the plant are removed before the plants sprout again in early spring. This can be done by mowing at about ten centimetres above the plant.

Additional fertiliser: is usually not required. It is more important to maintain the levels of organic matter. Also note the information on need & fertilising earlier in this chapter!

Pruning/trimming: Perennials do not necessarily have to be pruned. If the plant is left intact, the sprouting plant will grow through the dead parts in spring. The dead parts disappear under the plant during growth. This can be a solution for large beds to be managed with the Tram Robuste concept.

Weeding in subsequent years: weeding only needs to be done sporadically in subsequent years. When our Tram Robuste and Tram Vivas ranges are used correctly the soil will be quickly covered, giving weeds little or no chance to germinate.





Tram Prairie, drought-resistant planting

When we talk about climate change, the emphasis is usually on the fact that it will get warmer on average because of more CO2 in the atmosphere. That's true, but in recent years we are experiencing other consequences, such as periods of drought, heat and torrential rain. This in turn affects the choice of our range of plants for in public areas.



Drought-tolerant plants are more suited to survive longer dry periods and use less groundwater. Although all climate scenarios show an average increase in winter temperatures, these plantings must also be frost resistant. Mediterranean planting may not be appropriate without some thought!

Choosing plants that are adapted to future weather conditions will help to keep maintenance needs low.

Key considerations for Tram Prairie planting:

- Plant choice is not the only way to cope with a heat wave. Good design of planting areas is just as important. Good soil quality, containing enough organic matter or clay, helps to retain water for longer.
- Working with sufficiently large planting beds or containers gives plant roots a larger volume to draw water from.
- Proper drainage in case of flooding.
- Most drought-resistant plants are also sun-loving. Don't plant them in a shady location.

- 4-7 different perennials
- Drought tolerant
- Hardy and disease resistant
- Closed vegetation within a year
- Perennial flower bulbs
- Minimum 5-year lifespan of perennials
